7 8	<b>PREAMBLE</b> Whereas the function of the NASA Established Program to Stimulate Competitive Research			
9	(hereinafter referred to as NASA EPSCoR) Caucus (hereinafter referred to as the Caucus) is that			
10	of a support agency for NASA's EPSCoR program, and the Directors who are charged with the			
11 12	leadership of the programs within the eligible jurisdictions, and who constitute the membership of the Caucus; and

14	Whereas, the Caucus shares with NASA the goal of establishing an effective network of persons			
15	and institutions committed to the realization of the Nation's fullest potential in the development			
16 17	and effective utilization of the Nation's space- and aeronautics-related resources and technological and scientific competencies; and

19	Whereas the accomplishment of these objectives requires the establishment of orderly			
20 21	governance procedures, by which the Directors can effectively contribute their energies and talents towards a common goal,

22	we, u	he Directors, hereby adopt these Bylaws to define governance procedures of the Caucus.		
24		Article 1 -Meetings		
25	1.1	The Chair shall be the presiding officer at Caucus meetings. If the Chair is unable to		
26 27		attend the Caucus meeting, the Chair may designate one of the members of the Executive		
27 28		Committee to preside over the meeting. In the event the Chair is unable to make this designation, the Executive Committee will select one of its members to preside over the		
29		meeting.		
30	1.2	Meetings shall be held at least once each calendar year.		
31 32	1.3	Other meetings may be called at the discretion of the Caucus or by the Chair at the direction of the Executive Committee.		
33	1.4	The Directors shall be notified by the Chair or other member of the Executive Committee		
34		in writing of the time, place and proposed agenda of each meeting at least 30 days in		
35	15	advance. Electronic messages are an acceptable form of written communication.		
36 37	1.5 1.6	A quorum shall consist of a simple majority of the Caucus members. The conduct of all meetings shall be governed by the current edition of <i>Robert's Rules of</i>		
38	1.0	Order. In the event of conflict between Robert's Rules and specific terms of the Caucus		
39	1 -	Charter or Bylaws, the Charter and Bylaw terms shall prevail.		
40 41	1.7	The Secretary shall provide the Chair with a suitable permanent record of the minutes of each meeting and shall act as parliamentarian.

43		Article 2 - Voting Procedures		
44	2.1	Each jurisdiction shall have one vote and shall designate one Director as the official		

45		member of the Caucus.
46	2.2	Any Director may notify the presiding officer at any meeting of the Caucus that an
47		alternate person from within the respective jurisdiction is to represent the jurisdiction's
48		directorate in all matters before the Caucus at the specified meeting, including casting
49		votes, except that the alternate cannot serve as an officer or member of the Caucus
50		Executive Committee.
51	2.3	By written proxy any Director may authorize a representative of another jurisdiction to
52		cast a vote on behalf of the absent jurisdiction.
53	2.4	A simple majority of the membership shall constitute the quorum necessary for Caucus
54		action.
55	2.5	The Caucus may from time-to-time conduct votes a) by written solicitation or b) by a call
56		for response at a meeting of the Caucus or c) by email solicitation. In the event that a vote
57		taken in a Caucus meeting is inconclusive in that the votes of those not present would be
58		sufficient to affect the outcome, the Chair may seek supplemental mail/phone votes from
59		unrepresented jurisdiction to complete the balloting and to determine a definitive action
60		by the Caucus. If there is a quorum present, then the result of the vote should be final.
61	2.6	Any one member in attendance at a meeting may require that a formal vote count be
62		recorded in the minutes.
63	2.7	When a vote of a Director is required in a committee, subcommittee, working group, or
64		other meeting related to EPSCoR Caucus that takes place simultaneously with other
65		Caucus meetings, thereby preventing the Director from attending, the Director may notify
66		the chair of the respective committee that a designated alternate from the respective
67		jurisdiction will represent the jurisdiction's directorate in that committee, subcommittee,
68		working group or other meeting. Such designated alternate may serve in any capacity up
69		to and including the chair of the committee.
70	2.8	The National NASA EPSCoR Caucus can assess dues from its members as necessary.
71		The amount of such assessment must be determined by a 66% vote of the full Caucus.
72		
73		Article 3 -Officers and Committees
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75	3.1	Any member may serve as an officer or on Caucus Committees. Except as specified in
76		Section 2.7 above, non-members may represent a jurisdiction when appointed by the
77		Director on Caucus committees, but cannot serve as an officer or member of the Caucus
78		Executive Committee.
79	3.2	The following procedures shall govern the officers of the Caucus, their duties, and their
80 81		manner of selection:
82 83		A. Chair
84		1. The Caucus shall elect one of its members to serve as Chair of the Caucus for a
85		two-year term of office in odd-numbered years, effective July 1.
86		2. The Chair shall, in consultation with the Executive Committee, prepare a
87		preliminary agenda for meetings and preside over Caucus meetings.
88		3. The Chair shall represent the Caucus and carry out initiatives as directed by the
89		Caucus.
90		4. The Chair shall arrange for staff support for Caucus activities.

94 95		B. Vice-Chair
95 96		1. The Caucus shall elect one of its members to serve as Vice-chair of the Caucus
97		for a two-year term of office in odd-numbered years, effective July 1.
98		2. The Vice-Chair shall assist in the overall organization and management of the
99		Caucus as directed by the Chair.
100		3. The Vice-Chair shall assist in meeting logistics as directed by the Chair.
101		4. The Vice-Chair shall conduct surveys or other NASA EPSCoR Caucus
102		information gathering activities as directed by the Chair.
103		5. The Vice-Chair shall assume the position of the Chair, should the Chair be unable
		to complete their term.

100		C. Treasurer
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109		1. The Caucus shall elect one of its members to serve as Treasurer of the Caucus for
110		a two-year term of office in even-numbered years, effective July 1.
111		2. The Treasurer shall retain accurate and complete records of the Caucus finances,
112		provide for the security of such resources and their appropriate disbursement, and
113		submit an annual accounting to the membership.

115		D. Secretary
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117		1. The Caucus shall elect one of its members to serve as Secretary of the Caucus for
118		a two-year term of office in even-numbered years, effective July 1.
119		2. The Caucus Secretary shall also serve as the Executive Committee Secretary and
120		shall prepare minutes of all Caucus and Executive Committee meetings, to be
121 122		distributed in a timely fashion, with a copy of the Caucus-approved minutes to the Caucus Chair for the Caucus and Executive Committee archives.

125	3.3	Committees of the Caucus shall be Standing Committees and Special Committees.
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127	3.4	The following procedures govern the constitution and responsibilities of Standing
128 129		Committees:
130 131		A. Executive Committee
131		1. The Executive Committee shall consist of the four Caucus officers, four elected
132		members, and the past Caucus Chair as ex-officio.
134		2. The Caucus shall elect four of its members to serve on the Executive Committee
135		for two-year terms, two to commence in even-numbered years and two in odd-
136		numbered years, effective July 1.
137		3. The Executive Committee shall support the Chair's activities and assist the Chair
138		in maintaining effective communications with the membership.

120		4. The next Course she is shell some two years as a member of the Executive
139 140		4. The past Caucus chair shall serve two years as a member of the Executive Committee ex-officio with voting privileges.
140		5. The Executive Committee is authorized to fill officer and Executive Committee
142		vacancies, from the Caucus membership, for interim appointments with terms not
142		to exceed 12 months.
144		6. The Executive Committee has the specific responsibility of participating in the
145		preparation of draft agendas for Caucus meetings.
146		7. The Executive Committee shall elect one of its members to serve as the NASA
147		EPSCoR Caucus National EPSCoR Coalition and Foundation representative.
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		B. Nominating Committee
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151		1. The Nominating Committee shall consist of four Directors, elected by the Caucus
152		members. The term of the members of the Committee will be three years
153		(staggered), effective July 1. Except for the first year, where the committee will
154		be formed immediately after acceptance of the Caucus Bylaws. Each year the
155		Committee will choose one of its members to be the Chairperson of the
156		Committee, effective on July 1. The outgoing chair of the Nominating Committee
157		will notify the Chair of the Caucus of the new Nominating Committee Chair on or
158		before July 1.
159 160		2. When elections are needed, the Chair of the Caucus shall instruct the Nominating Committee at least three months in advance of when the term of the elected office
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161		begins. The Nominating Committee is responsible for conducting nominations and elections. The Chair of the Committee shall announce the results.
162		<ol> <li>The Nominating Committee shall prepare slates of nominees for officers and</li> </ol>
164		elected committees and shall distribute such slates to the membership prior to the
165		meetings at which elections are scheduled to take place. Additional nominations
166		from the floor will be accepted. All nominees must accept the nomination for
167		office. The Committee shall give due consideration to the representation of the
168		diversity of interests of the caucus and to demographic diversity in the preparation
169		of its slates of nominees.
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171	3.5	Standing Committees may organize such sub-committees as they deem fit and recruit
172		such other Caucus members or their representatives to serve on the Sub-Committees as
173		may be necessary.
174	3.6	Special Committees may be authorized by the Chair or by vote of the membership for
175		any purpose not served by a Standing Committee.
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177		Article 4 - Amendment of Bylaws
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179	4.1	These bylaws may be amended by written approval of at least 66% of the membership.
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
